

RE-ACCREDITATION & GENERAL RULES

RE-ACCREDITATION:

K.M.C. College has received Permanent Affiliation from the University of Mumbai has been reaccredited with grade 'B' by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Government of India.

INTERACTION WITH PARENTS:

The college offers many opportunities for interaction with parents in matters concerning attendance, discipline, academics etc.

GENERAL RULES:

- Attendance of every class will be taken and review of attendance will be undertaken at the end of each month. Those with poor attendance have the possibility of their admission being cancelled.
- Lectures on various subjects by visiting lecturers will be arranged in the months of Nov., Dec. and Jan.
- All theory and practical periods will be carried out strictly according to the college time table.
- Syllabus of every class shall be completed at least 15 days before commencement of examination.
- 5) Cultural Competitions shall be organized by the Cultural Committee. No activity will be permitted without prior permission of the Cultural Committee. However the Principal has the right to change the schedule without any prior notice, at any given time.



GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

A) ELIGIBILITY AND PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

- A student passing XII standard in a given stream can apply for admission to the first year B.A., B.Com or B.Sc. classes as applicable.
- 2) A student passing XII Science/ Commerce can seek admission to F.Y.B.A. Course.
- Students migrating to this college from colleges affiliated to Universities other than Mumbai University must produce a **Provisional Eligibility Certificate** from the University of Mumbai. No Student will be admitted without this.
- 4) Students migrating to this college from another college affiliated to the Mumbai University will have to produce a **Transfer Certificate** from the college last attended. If migrating from a college affiliated to another University, students will have to produce in addition, a **Migration Certificate** from the previous University. Such admissions will be treated provisional until the above certificates are submitted to the college.
- 5) Students from other colleges affiliated to Mumbai University seeking admission in this college for the second Semester should produce a 'No Objection Certificate' from the Principal of the college last attended. This facility is to be allowed only for students whose parents are on Government Transfer.
- Admission Form must be duly filled and accompanied by the necessary fees and documents.
- Students passing other equivalent examinations from other Boards should produce an Eligibility Certificate from Maharashtra H.S.C. Board, Mumbai.
- Students having Mathematics in 12th Science only can apply for admission to the first year B.Sc. Computer Science.
- Students need to submit all the above documents failing which they will not get university enrollment which is done online through E- Suvidha
- Admission to T.Y.B.Com (Finance Subject) will be purely on merit based on the performance of the student in S.Y.B.Com.
- 11) Only 24 students will be granted admission according to merit in the grantable section of each subject in T.Y.B.A. The rest of the students will get admission in non-grantable section.

B) RULES FOR ADMISSION

- The Principal is the final authority and reserves all rights to refuse admission to any learner without assigning any reason there to.
- Learners seeking admission to the college will be given the college prospectus along with the prescribed form. The form with all necessary information should be duly filled and necessary documents must be attached.
- All admissions are provisional subject to the confirmation of the University.
- 4) All admissions are valid for one academic year only and will have to be renewed by a fresh application every subsequent year.
- 5) To confirm his/her admission the learner will have to pay the required fees on the same day, failing which his/her admission will be automatically cancelled.
- 6) During admission the concerned student should be personally present in the office.
- 7) Learners are required to preserve all receipts. At the time of refund of deposit the receipt must be produced. Without receipt the deposit amount will not be refunded. The office will not supply the receipts nos. etc. No request for refunds shall be entertained without proper receipt.
- Original school leaving certificate of XII thas the case may be will have to be deposited with the college. Under no circumstances shall such certificate be returned to the learners except when he/she desires to disenroll himself/herself from the college.







- 9) Identity Cards will be issued to new learners at the time of admission. Learners must produce the cards on demand by college authorities including teaching and non-teaching staff. It should always be carried by the learner when in college premises.
- 10) A student seeking admission to any class must duly fill the Admission form and complete other formalities regarding EBC/PTC/BC, Scholarship, etc. The students will not be admitted to any course unless the above forms are submitted to the office.
- 11) Admission to F.Y. classes will be based on merit and as per University and Government rules. Admission Schedule will be displayed on the notice-board immediately after H.S.C. result.
- 12) Students who have completed Diploma in Engineering with Mathematics subject may take direct admission to S.Y.B.Sc. (Subject to seat availability)
- 13) Students taking admission from other states are required to submit migration certificate & transfer certificate with verification immediately after admission process.

C) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

First Year Arts, Commerce and Science:

- 1) Duly filled in College Admission Form and printout of online form.
- 2) Original Jr. College leaving certificate and 2 copies of the same. (Self attested with student signature)
- 3) Original mark sheet of 10th and 12th and its 2 copies. (Self attested with student signature)
- Three Passport size latest color photograph.
- 5) All learners have to submit enrollment form along with the admission form. Late submission of the enrolment form may result in the cancellation of admission to the concerned class. Learners will be wholly responsible for such cancellation.
- Learners coming from other states have to submit migration certificate from their respective University.
- 7) Gap Certificate if necessary.
- 8) The learners belong to SC/ST/NT/VJ/OBC/SBC must submit:
 - a) Caste Certificate with one self attested copy of the same
 - b) Non-Creamy layer Certificate with one self attested copy of the same (for NT / OBC /SBC learners)



APPENDIX

Ordinance relating to the refund of the fees in all the faculties (Univ. Circular No. UG/412 of 2008)

0.2859: (a) Refund of Tuition, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admissions: The candidates who have taken admission in under graduate courses in Govt. colleges, In Govt. aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges, and recognized Institutions may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30th day after the date of cancellation and thereafter. The percentage of fee for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows:

NOTE:

The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of academic term of the course includes the following.

- All the fees items are chargeable for one year as per relevant University circulars for different Faculties (excluding the course for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities)
- The Fee charged towards group insurance and all fee components to be paid as University share(including Vice-Chancellor fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-charges, disaster management fund, exam fee and enrollment fee) are non refundable if payment is made by the college prior to the date of the cancellation.
- 3) Fee collected for Identity card and Library card, admission form and Prospectus, enrollment and any other course specific fee are **not refundable** after the commencement of the academic term.
- All refundable deposits (Laboratory, caution money and Library etc. shall be returned in full at the time of cancellation.

These rules concern admissions are made through centralized admission process for professional and / or for any other courses by other competent Authorities, (as per the rule of relevant agencies) for the 1^{st} year admission. In case of admission to subsequent years of the course, 0.2859 is applicable for cancellation of admission.

Provided further that this refund rule is concurrent with the rules and guidelines of other professional statutory bodies appointed for admission for relevant courses.

Further that 0.2859-A & 0.2859-B gave repealed and amended 0.2859 relating to the refund of Tuition Fees, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admission for Under Graduate Courses has been brought into force with effect from the academic year 2008-09.

STUDENT AID FUND:

The college has a Student's Aid Fund from which deserving and needy students are given financial assistance to meet their tuition / Examination fees etc. Students may apply in response to the notice in this regard

Rajiv Gandhi Students' Accident Insurance Grant:

Application Procedure:

Applicant should submit application in writing in three copies. Documents mentioned in Proforma B (available in College office) should be enclosed with the application.

Principal or Management members should sign and put remarks on the application and send one copy to Tahsildar and another copy to Education Officer (Primary, Z.P.) within 15 days.





- The college attaches great importance to discipline which must be scrupulously observed by all students. Failure to comply with any of the rules, regulations or requirements notified from time to time will lead to strict disciplinary action.
- 2) The Students must wear the college Identity Card in the college premises at all times.
- Students must attend lectures, tutorials or seminars according to the Time Table on all working days of the college. They should not remain absent without the prior permission of the Principal.
- 4) Students must not attend classes other than their own.
- 5) Students must not loiter in the college premises during class hours.
- 6) Smoking, tobacco chewing, Drugs etc. are strictly prohibited in the college premises.
- 7) No student is allowed to conduct political activities within the college premises.
- 8) No student should communicate any information to the press or write any matter concerning the college without the prior permission and approval of the Principal.
- 9) If for any reason the continuance of students is in the opinion of the Principal detrimental to the interest of the college, the Principal may ask him to leave the college without assigning any reason for his decision.
- 10) Disturbance during lectures is strictly forbidden.
- 11) Students must not tamper with electrical fittings of the college as it may prove fatal.
- 12) Students must take proper care of all college property. No damage should be done to the property of the college such as disfiguring walls, doors, windows, electrical fittings or breaking of the furniture. Anyone violating the law will be fined and dealt with strictly.
- 13) Disobedience, misconduct, misbehavior or failure to comply with any one of the rules, regulations or requirements notified from time to time will result in heavy fine, loss of terms or any other disciplinary action.
- 14) Science students must handle the apparatus carefully. Any damage done to the equipments will be assessed by the Professor in-charge and the students will have to pay the full amount for its replacement.
- 15) Students must appear for terminal or preliminary examination held by the college. Those students who remain absent for the said examinations without prior permission of the Principal will not be eligible to fill examination forms. Their forms will not be sent to the University.
- 16) Strict discipline must be maintained at the time of the college elections, functions and programmes.
- 17) Matters not covered by the existing rules will rest at the absolute discretion of the Principal.

RAGGING

PREVENTION OF RAGGING IN THE COLLEGE PREMISES:

Students and parents are informed that RAGGING is banned and shall be considered as a serious offence which will attract severe punishment. Parents are requested to emphasize on their wards the seriousness of the offence and instruct them not to indulge in RAGGING.

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009 (under Section 26 (1) (g) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956)

Full text is available on our website, www.kmccollegekhopoli.in and with the Office Superintendent in the college office. Important aspects of the Regulation are given below:

1. WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING: RAGGING CONSTITUTES ONE OR MORE OF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING ACTS:

- Any conduct by any learner or learners whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any learner or learners which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- Asking any learner to do any act which such learner will not in the ordinary course do and which has
 the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to
 adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- Any act by a senior learner that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other learner or a fresher;
- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other learner for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of learners ,
- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other learner by learners;
- g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other learner;
- I. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student.

2. ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY THE HEAD OF THE INSTITUTION:

On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorized by him on his behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- Abetment to ragging;
- ii. Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- iii. Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- iv. Public nuisance created during ragging;
- v. Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- vi. Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- vii. Wrongful restraint;
- viii. Wrongful confinement;
- ix. Use of criminal force;
- Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences;
- xi. Extortion;
- xii. Criminal trespass
- xiii. Offences against property;
- xiv. Criminal intimidation;
- xv. Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- xvi. Threat to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- xvii. Physical or psychological humiliation;
- xviii. All other offences following from the definition of "Ragging".







3. ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING:

- 3.1 The institution shall punish a learner found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:
- a) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely:
- i. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges,
- ii. Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship and other benefits,
- iii. Debarring from appearing in any test /examination or other evaluation process.
- iv. Withholding results,
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional national or International meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- vi. Cancellation of admission,
- vii. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- viii. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS CELL (ICC)

The ICC has been formed as an initiative under the directive of the Maharashtra State Commission for women. The cell will address sexual harassment cases filed by any female employee of the college or any student. Discretion will be mantained while investigating such cases.

WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CELL

The Women's cell arranges programmes on gender sensitization & lectures on health, hygiene, legal affairs etc.

STUDENT'S COUNSELLING CELL

The Women's cell arranges programmes on gender sensitization & lectures on health, hygiene, legal affairs etc.

ATTENDANCE:

- Learners are advised to attend all lectures, practical and tutorials regularly. Absence from a Single lecture will be considered as the absence for the whole day.
- 2) Employed learners are advised to seek admission through Institution of Distance Education University of Mumbai since they cannot fulfill the obligations of attending all lectures, practical's and tutorials as prescribed by the University. If any student takes up employment after getting admission, the college authorities will not be responsible for inadequate attendance of such students.
- 3) Ordinance 0.125 The following shall be the minimum attendance for keeping terms. Arts, Science & Commerce First terms/second terms 80 % of the days on which lectures are delivered and practical's, tutorials conducted in each term.

IDENTITY CARDS:

The Identity card is meant for identifying bonafide students and is used for permitting the learners to participate in college activities and programmes. The identity card must be worn at all times in the college. In case it is lost, the matter must be immediately reported to the office so that a duplicate identity card may be issued on payment of an additional charge.

LIBRARY:

PROSPECTUS 2018-19

The college library will remain open on all days except (Sunday and other holidays) from 8.00 am. To 5.00 p.m. for students and staff of our college. At present the library has a collection of over 47,374 books on various subjects. Our Library is subscribing to $\underline{59}$ Periodical and Journals for subject reading and general reading. $\underline{14}$ Newspapers and Books on current Awareness and various competitive examinations are also available in the college Library. Reading room facility is also available in the library for students.

Our college library has also subscribed UGC sponsored INFLIBNETN-LIST e-database which provides access to various National and International Journals through internet. The college library also has a good collection of Multimedia CDs. Our college library also gives reference service to learners and staff members. Internet facility is provided to learners at free of cost.

LIBRARY RULES:

Complete Silence must be observed in the library and reading room. The reading room will remain open in the morning and afternoon for the students.

Pencil or ink marking on the books in any way will be treated as a breach of library discipline and the book will have to be replaced.

To obtain membership learners will have to produce their identity cards and pay the prescribed amount as deposit. Books will not be issued without identity card. Only one book will be issued at a time to the learner. The book will be issued for a period of seven days and if the learner fails to return it within the stipulated period he/she will have to pay a fine fifty paisa per day.

Magazines and periodicals are not allowed to be taken out of the library. Learners can read them in the library on presenting their identity card. The principal reserves the right to make alternations in library rules as and when required. Use of Mobile Telephones is strictly prohibited in the library. Library facilities of the defaulting learner will be suspended.

BOOK BANK:

The college provides books from the book bank to SC/ST students and to those from economically weak backgrounds.

INTERNET & REPROGRAPHIC FACILITIES:

Free Internet is available in the library for student reference work. Xerox facilities are also available in the Library.

COLLEGE LABORATORIES:

The College has spacious and well equipped laboratories in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Computer Science, Psychology, Geography & English

OPEN MERIT SCHOLARSHIP:

Open merit scholarship is awarded by the Govt. to the student who secures more than 60% marks in the HSC exam, any student who wishes to avail these advantages must apply for the same.

- 8) A certificate of Hostel rector by a Hostelite Learner.
- 9) If B.C. Scholarship is taken in other college last year, certificate from the respective college.
- 10) An unsuccessful learner previous of year has to submit new application.
- 11) The student whose guardian has income more than Rs.100000/- has to submit fee concession form.
- 12) The learner whose guardian is in service should submit pay certificate (with Basic +Pay + DA + HRA + Other etc.) duly signed by concerned authority.
- 13) Married girl learner should submit her husband's income certificate duly signed by concerned authority.
- 14) Learners who get scholarship should open an account in Bank of India, Khopoli Branch and submit a passport sized photograph in college office.
- 15) Learners below 18 years must open joint account with their Parents / Guardians.
- 16) Xerox copy of Aadhar card should be submitted to avail the above scholarship/free ship.

ATKT RULES

- Alearner who has failed in subject of semister I & III may appear for the ATKT exam conducted in April. Similarly those failing in Semister II & IV may appear for ATKT exams held in October.
- A learner of Arts or Commerce faculty who fails in a maximum of two papers per Semester is allowed to keep terms for the next academic year.
- A learner of the Science faculty who fails in a maximum of Three papers per Semester is allowed to keep terms for the next academic year.
- A learner of SY classes who has more than 900 maximum marks in each semester & fails in a maximum of 3 papers per semester is allowed to keep terms for the next academic year.
- Learners found adopting unfair means at the examinations, tests etc. will be dealt with as per the University Rules, MU Act 1994 and the provisions of Act No XXX1/1982 as the case may be.

GRADING AND AVERAGE (GPA CALCULATION)

Semester Grade point Average (SGPA):- Each Semester grade point average is calculated by dividing the total of Product of grade (quality) point and course credit by sum of all course credits in a semester.

- The total credits cover the core, elective, field work or extension activities, soft skills etc..
- GPA is calculated at the end of each term after grades have been processed and after any grade have been updated or changed.
- Same criteria are to be followed for Individual assignment / Quizzes / Test / Unit Test / Tutorials / Practical / Projects / Seminar.
- The teacher should convert his/ her marking in to the quality points/ grade points and letter grade.

CIRCULAR NO.2

Exam Fees University Circular - "In partial modification to circulars CONCOL/Fee/134 of 2008 dated 23rd May, 2008 and CONCOL/Fee/292 of 2008 dated 7th July, 2008 the examinations fees to be charged to the students of the BA, B.Com. and the B.Sc. programs (Regular programs and excluding the self financing courses) admitted under the semester Based Credit & Grading System for Semester I and Semester II are modified".

University Circular No.UG/82 of 2013-2014 dt. 23rd December, 2013 AC7/6/2013 Item no.4.15 R.8654 ATKT rules for M.Sc. Program for Credit Based Semester & **Grading System**

- i) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for semester II irrespective of number of heads of failure in the semester I.
- ii) A learner shall be allowed to take admission and to keep terms and appear for semester III irrespective of number of heads of failure in the semester I and II.
- iii) A learner after attending semester III is allowed to go to semester IV.
- iv) A learner shall be allowed to keep tern and allowed to appear for semester IV irrespective of number of heads of failure in semester I,II and III. However the result of the semester IV shall be kept at abeyance until the learner passes each of the semester I, semester II, semester III.
- V) A learner will have to earn a minimum of 96 credits to pass the M.Sc. degree.
- VI) Those who fail in any course in any semester will have to clear the same in the examination conducted in the corresponding odd or even semester.
